UPCOMING GAMES



Monday, Jan. 18, 2010 vs. Oklahoma City Thunder (2 p.m.)

TV: SPSO HD/NBA TV ... Radio: 790 The Zone/XM 234

The Thunder visit Philips Arena for the only time this year in the first-of-two games with the Hawks ... Atlanta heads to Oklahoma City on 2/2 to close-out the season series ... The Hawks swept two games from the Thunder last year, a 99-88 home win on 12/23 and an 89-85 road triumph on 11/9, and has now won three straight overall in the series ... Atlanta leads the all-time series 61-54, including a 37-21 home record.



Wednesday, Jan. 20, 2010 vs. Sacramento Kings (7 p.m.)

TV: SPSO HD ... Radio: 790 The Zone/Sirius 90

Atlanta hosts Sacramento for the only time this year in the second-of-two contests between the clubs ... The Hawks took a 113-105 road decision on 11/4 behind 26 points apiece from Joe Johnson and Jamal Crawford ... Kevin Martin had 29 points and 11 rebounds for the Kings, and Jason Thompson added 22 points and 12 boards ... The Hawks have now won four straight against Sacramento and three-in-a-row at home ... The Kings lead the all-time series 152-146, with the Hawks holding an 81-29 advantage in home games.



Friday, Jan. 22, 2010 vs. Charlotte Bobcats (7:30 p.m.)

TV: SPSO HD ... Radio: 790 The Zone/Sirius 121

Charlotte comes to Philips Arena for the first time this year in the second-of-four contests with Atlanta ... The Bobcats took a 103-83 decision in Charlotte on 11/6 in game one ... Joe Johnson, Josh Smith and Jamal Crawford all had 13 points for the Hawks ... Raja Bell paced the Bobcats with 24, while Gerald Wallace had 11 points and 18 rebounds ... Charlotte has now won two-straight against Atlanta, but the Hawks have taken four-in-a-row at Philips Arena ... The teams play again on 3/19 at Philips Arena and 4/6 in Charlotte to finish the season series ... The Bobcats leads the all-time series 13-8, with the Hawks holding a 6-4 advantage in home games.

* Amber Holmes from Lovejoy High School in Clayton County, winner of the "Atlanta Hawks Poetry Slam" contest, will perform her poetry at halftime of today's annual Martin Luther King, Jr. Holiday game against the Oklahoma City Thunder. The Hawks teamed-up with the United Way to host the contest which asked area high school students to write a poem with the theme "Live United." Additional festivities this afternoon include a halftime choir concert and video tribute to Dr. King, as well as a postgame Step Show held in conjunction with Hawks PA announcer and V103 personality Ryan Cameron. The winning team will receive a championship trophy along with the opportunity to perform at a Step Show hosted by Cameron on February 20 at the Georgia World Congress Center, as well as other prizes. NEWS & NOTES

* The Hawks are currently leading the Southeast Division (0.5 games ahead of Orlando). The last time the Hawks were in first place in their division was 1998-99, when Atlanta was 29-17 through April 28.

* Joe Johnson made the 1,000th three-pointer of his career on 1/11 at Boston. Johnson has made 635 three's as a Hawk and trails Jason Terry by 10 for second place on Atlanta's all-time list.

* The Hawks signed guard Mario West to a 10-day contract on 1/12. West, who attended Douglas County High School in Douglasville before a four-year career at Georgia Tech, has appeared in 117 regular season games with the Hawks over the last two years, averaging 0.9 ppg and 0.9 rpg in 4.6 mpg (.422 FG%, .554 FT%).

January 24, 1960 – The St. Louis Hawks post a 155-129 home victory over the New York Knicks, setting single-game franchise records for points and assists (47). The Hawks also scored 155 points in a game at San Diego on February 11, 1970.
