UPCOMING GAMES



Wednesday, Feb. 17, 2010 at Los Angeles Clippers (10:30 p.m.)
TV: SPSO ... Radio: 790 The Zone/XM 233

The Clippers host Atlanta for the only time this year in the second-of-two games between the clubs ... The Hawks took a 103-97 home decision in game one on 2/3 ... Joe Johnson led the way with 34 and Jamal Crawford added 22 ... Chris Kaman had 17 points and 10 boards to lead L.A., while Marcus Camby pulled down 20 rebounds ... Atlanta won the last meeting in Los Angeles, a 97-80 triumph on 1/14/09 ... The Hawks lead the all-time series 67-36, including a 28-22 road record.



Friday, Feb. 19, 2010 at Phoenix Suns (9 p.m.)
TV: SPSO ... Radio: 790 The Zone/Sirius 130

Atlanta visits Phoenix for the only time this season in the second-of-two games between the teams ... Jamal Crawford's three-pointer as time expired gave the Hawks a 102-101 home victory in the first contest ... Al Horford scored 24 points, Crawford finished with 22, and Josh Smith had 20 points and 15 boards for Atlanta ... The Suns were led by Amar'e Stoudemire's 28 points and 14 rebounds ... The Hawks have dropped two straight games at Phoenix, with their last win coming on 2/9/07 (120-111) ... Atlanta has not had a two game sweep of the Suns since the 1991-92 season (the Hawks won the only meeting between the teams in 1998-99) ... Phoenix leads the all-time series 62-47 (38-15 at home).



Sunday, Feb. 21, 2010 at Golden State Warriors (8 p.m.)
TV: ESPN ... Radio: 790 The Zone/XM 235

The Hawks and Warriors meet for the first-of-two games this year and for the only time at ORACLE Arena ... The clubs have split the season series each of the last two seasons ... Atlanta has won two-of-the-last-three at ORACLE Arena, but dropped the last game 119-114 on 1/16/09 ... The teams play again on 3/5 at Philips Arena to finish the season series ... The Hawks lead the all-time series 138-133, with the Warriors holding a 73-43 advantage in home games.

* The Hawks are celebrating Black History Month by honoring several prominent Atlanta-area leaders during February home games, including Ken Hudson (second African-American game official in NBA history), Thomas G. Sampson (Co-founder and managing partner of Thomas, Kennedy, Sampson & Tompkins, Atlanta's oldest minority-owned law firm), the Spelman College "Spellbots" (the school's robotics team), the Youth Ensemble of Atlanta (an organization which provides young people with free performing arts training), Dr. Beverly Hall (Superintendent of Atlanta Public Schools) and Xernona Clayton (President and CEO of the Trumpet Awards Foundation, Inc.).

NEWS & NOTES

* Guard Joe Johnson replaced Philadelphia's Allen Iverson in the Eastern Conference's starting lineup at the 2010 NBA All-Star Game in Dallas on 2/14. Johnson, making his fourth straight All-Star appearance, became the first Hawks player to start in the mid-season classic since Dikembe Mutombo in the 1997-98 season. He finished the game with 10 points, (4-8 FGs, 2-5 3FGs), 1 rebound and 1 assist in 18 minutes of action. Big man Al Horford made his first career All-Star appearance, seeing 14 minutes of work off the bench. He ended the night with 8 points (4-5 FGs), 4 rebounds, 2 assists, 1 steal and 1 block. Johnson also participated in the Haier Shooting Stars competition on 2/13 as part of NBA All-Star Saturday Night, joining former Hawks star Steve Smith and Atlanta Dream guard Angel McCoughtry, representing Team Atlanta.

* The NBA announced the rescheduling of the Atlanta Hawks at Washington Wizards game that was postponed on 2/6. The Hawks and Wizards will make up that game on 3/11 at 7:00 p.m. ET at Verizon Center in Washington DC.

* With 3 steals at Memphis on 2/9, Josh Smith moved into 9th place on the Hawks career steals list (currently at 520), passing Jon Koncak. Smith trails Stacy Augmon (570 steals) by 50 for 8th place.

* At the All-Star break, the Hawks led the league in least player games missed due to injury, at 14 total. The next-closest team is Minnesota with 32 games missed, while Golden State (294) had missed the most.

February 21, 1979 – Wayne "Tree" Rollins notches the first recorded triple-double in Hawks history with 11 points, 13 rebounds and a franchise record 12 blocked shots in Atlanta's 106-83 home win over Portland.
