UPCOMING GAMES



Monday, Apr. 12, 2010 at Milwaukee Bucks (8 p.m.)

Atlanta heads to Milwaukee for the second time in the third-and-final meeting with the Bucks ... The teams have split two games this year, each winning at home ... The Hawks took game one 106-102 in overtime on 2/28 ... Joe Johnson led the way with 24 points, and Josh Smith (22 points/ 15 rebounds) and Al Horford (17 points/10 boards) each posted double-doubles ... Milwaukee's John Salmons led all scorers with 32 ... The Bucks evened things up with 98-95 decision on 3/22 ... Salmons again led the way with 32 points ... Johnson scored for 27 for the Hawks and Jamal Crawford tallied 21 ... Horford had another double-double with 12 points and 12 rebounds ... Atlanta has dropped five-of-the-last six contests in Milwaukee ... The Bucks lead the all-time series 96-91, including a 60-29 home record.



Wednesday, Apr. 14, 2010 vs. Cleveland Cavaliers (8 p.m.)

The Cavaliers visit Philips Arena for the second time in the fourth-and-final contest against the Hawks ... The game is the regular season finale for both clubs ... Cleveland is 3-0 against Atlanta on the year, including a 95-84 triumph at Philips Arena on 12/29 ... Mo Williams scored 20 points, and LeBron James had 14 and 10 assists ... Jamal Crawford paced the Hawks with 26 points ... The Cavs also posted two home wins – 106-101 on 12/30 and 93-88 on 4/2 ... James recorded 48 points and 10 rebounds in game two, with Williams adding 14 points and 10 assists ... Joe Johnson led Atlanta with 35 points and Mike Bibby had 20 ... James again led the way in game three with 27 points and 13 boards, and Williams scored 24 points ... Josh Smith topped the Hawks with 20 points ... The Cavs have won five straight games against Atlanta, including two-in-a-row at Philips Arena ... The Hawks lead the all-time series 102-93 (61-34 at home).

NEWS & NOTES

* On 4/5, Al Horford was named the Southeast Division winner for the 2009-10 NBA Sportsmanship Award. The NBA Sportsmanship Award, designed to honor a player who best represents the ideals of sportsmanship on the court, is voted on by NBA players. The NBA will announce the winner after the regular season. Other divisional winners included Boston's Ray Allen, Cleveland's Antawn Jamison, Denver's Chauncey Billups, Houston's Luis Scola and Phoenix's Grant Hill.

* Following the Hawks season finale versus Cleveland on 4/14 at Philips Arena (8 p.m. tipoff), the organization will present the Kia Motors Fan Favorite Award. Fans were able to vote for their favorite Hawks at greater metro Atlanta Kia retailers, Hawks home games and online.

* Last Friday's 107-101 win over Toronto saw the Hawks reach the 50-win mark on the season for the ninth time in Atlanta history. The Hawks last hit the half-century mark in 1997-98 (50-32).

* With 33 home wins (one game still to play), the Hawks have their most since a 36-5 mark in 1996-97. Atlanta is currently riding an 11-game home win streak, their best since winning 20 consecutive during the same campaign.

* Jamal Crawford notched the 28th four-point play of his career on 4/10 at Washington (and ninth of the season), extending his NBA career record. He surpassed Reggie Miller's record of 24 earlier this season.

* On 4/10 at Washington, Al Horford saw his career-high streak of 33 consecutive games (2/2-4/9) scoring in double-figures snapped. Horford still has one streak intact, a career-best 22 straight made free throws.

* Jason Collins has missed the last three games with a sore right foot. He is currently listed as day-to-day.

* The Hawks have gone 47 straight games without suffering a three-game losing streak, the longest current stretch in the league.
