#### GAME ONE RECAP

The Hawks built a 24-point lead early in the 2<sup>nd</sup> half and held off the Bucks down the stretch to take 1-0 lead in the best-of-7 first round series ... The Hawks used first quarter runs of 11-0 and 9-0 to take a 34-17 lead ... Atlanta led by as many as 23 in the 2nd quarter before settling for a 62-40 advantage at the break ... It was the sixth-highest scoring first half in Hawks postseason history ... Atlanta pushed the lead to 66-42 early in the 3<sup>rd</sup> before the Bucks went on a 28-11 spurt to get back in it ... Joe Johnson finished with 22 points, 7 rebounds and 5 assists to lead Atlanta and Mike Bibby had 19 points (8-9 FGs, 3-3 3FGs) ... Jamal Crawford put in 17, Al Horford 15 (also 5 blocks), and Josh Smith (also 10 boards and 4 blocks) and Marvin Williams each had 12 ... Brandon Jennings finished with a game-high 34 to lead the Bucks and John Salmons had 16 points and 6 steals ... Atlanta finished shooting 53.9% from the field and 6-11 from three-point range (54.5%) ... Milwaukee hit 45.1% from the floor and 8-20 from distance (30.0%).

#### REGULAR SEASON SERIES

The Hawks and Bucks match-up in the playoffs after meeting three times during the regular season ... Atlanta won the season series 2-1, including a 106-102 OT home win on 2/28 ... The teams split two games in Milwaukee, with the Bucks winning 98-95 (3/22) and the Hawks taking a 104-96 decision (4/12) ... Joe Johnson averaged 27.3 points against the Bucks during the regular season, while Jamal Crawford put in 17.5 ... Al Horford (14.0 points/11.3 rebounds) and Josh Smith (14.0 points/10.7 rebounds) each averaged a double-double ... In three games against the Hawks, John Salmons tallied 30.7 points ... Milwaukee leads the all-time regular season series 96-92 (60-30 at home) ... The Hawks lead 61-34 in games played in Atlanta ... This is the fourth time the teams have met in the postseason (all in the first round) ... Milwaukee took a five game set (3-2) in 1983-84, the Hawks posted a 3-2 series win in 1987-88, and the Bucks won again in 1988-89 (3-2).

### NEWS & NOTES

\* In his sixth season at the helm, Mike Woodson led his club to the fifth-best win total in franchise history at 53-29.

\* With 34 home wins, the Hawks had their most since a 36-5 mark in 1996-97. Atlanta finished the season riding a 12-game home win streak, their best since winning 20 consecutive during the same campaign.

\* Several Hawks finished the regular season ranked among the NBA's best in a variety of statistical categories : Mike Bibby – t5<sup>th</sup> in A/TO ratio (3.44), 37<sup>th</sup> in apg (3.9), t31<sup>st</sup> in 3FG% (.389) and t27<sup>th</sup> in 3FGM (126) ... Jamal Crawford – 29<sup>th</sup> in ppg (18.0), 7<sup>th</sup> in 3FGM (163) and 18<sup>th</sup> in FT% (.857) ... Al Horford – 8<sup>th</sup> in FG% (.551), 10<sup>th</sup> in rpg (9.9), t9<sup>th</sup> in off. rpg (2.9), t10<sup>th</sup> in double-doubles (39), 26<sup>th</sup> in bpg (1.1) and 22<sup>nd</sup> in efficiency rating (21.3) ... Joe Johnson – 11<sup>th</sup> in ppg (21.3), 11<sup>th</sup> in FGM (635), t24<sup>th</sup> in 3FGM (129), t26<sup>th</sup> in apg (4.9) and t10<sup>th</sup> in mpg (38.0) ... Josh Smith – 3<sup>rd</sup> in bpg (2.1), 3<sup>rd</sup> in total blocks (172), 18<sup>th</sup> in rpg (8.7), t12<sup>th</sup> in off. rpg (2.8), 11<sup>th</sup> in spg (1.6), t24<sup>th</sup> in FG% (.505), 24<sup>th</sup> in double-doubles (27), 33<sup>rd</sup> in apg (4.2), t38<sup>th</sup> in mpg (35.4) and 18<sup>th</sup> in efficiency rating (21.8).

\* Josh Smith finished the season as the only player in the league averaging at least 15.0 ppg, 8.0 rpg and 4.0 apg. At 6-foot-9, he was the tallest player in the top 12 in steals in the NBA, and the shortest in the top 12 in blocks. Smith put up 15.7 ppg, 8.7 rpg (18<sup>th</sup> in NBA) and 4.2 apg (33<sup>rd</sup>), to go along with 2.1 bpg (3<sup>rd</sup>) and 1.6 spg (11<sup>th</sup>).

\* With the April 14 win over Cleveland (99-83), the Hawks clinched their 10<sup>th</sup> consecutive winning month, the third longest streak in club history.

\* Al Horford ended the regular season making 25 consecutive free throws, the longest streak of his career.

\* A leading candidate for the Sixth Man Award, Jamal Crawford finished 2<sup>nd</sup> on the team in ppg at 18.0 ppg (29<sup>th</sup> in the NBA), in 31.1 mpg. He led the league in scoring among players who didn't start a game this season. Additionally, he was 7<sup>th</sup> in the league in 3FGM (163) and 18<sup>th</sup> in FT% (.857).

\* Following Atlanta's 99-83 win over the Cleveland at Philips Arena (4/14), Hawks guard Joe Johnson was presented with the Kia Motors Fan Favorite award by Kia Regional Retail Marketing Manager Ashley Lord and Hawks fan Reginald Ramey.

\* The Hawks finished the season with 49 straight games without suffering a three-game losing streak, the longest current stretch in the league.
