### UPCOMING GAMES



**MIAMI  
HEAT**

**Monday, Apr. 11, 2011 vs. Miami Heat (7 p.m.)**

**TV: SportSouth HD ... Radio: 97.9 FM**

The Heat visit Philips Arena for the second time in the fourth-and-final meeting with the Hawks ... The teams split two games in Miami, the Heat winning 89-77 (12/4) and Atlanta taking a 93-89 overtime decision on 1/18 ... Chris Bosh (27 points/10 rebounds), Dwyane Wade (26 points/10 boards) and LeBron James (22 points) combined for 75 points in game one, while Al Horford scored 22 (10-11 FGs) for Atlanta ... Joe Johnson (19 points/10 assists) and Josh Smith (15 points/12 rebounds) recorded double-doubles in game two, while James and Wade paced Miami with 34 and 27 points ... The Heat also posted a 106-85 triumph at Philips Arena on 3/18 behind James' 43 ... Marvin Williams put in 15 to lead the Hawks ... Miami leads the all-time series 47-39, with Atlanta holding a 27-15 advantage in home games.



**Wednesday, Apr. 13, 2011 at Charlotte Bobcats (8 p.m.)**

Atlanta travels to Charlotte for the second time this year in the fourth-and-final game with the Bobcats ... The Hawks own a 2-1 series lead, winning the first contest in Charlotte and splitting two games at Philips Arena ... All five starters scored in double-figures, including Josh Smith (12 points/11 rebounds) as Atlanta took a 90-85 home decision on 12/17 ... Former Hawks Boris Diaw and D.J. Augustin each scored 22 for the Bobcats ... Atlanta picked up a road win on 1/22, 103-87, behind 32 points from Joe Johnson ... Augustin's 20 led the Bobcats ... Former Hawk Stephen Jackson's jumper as time expired gave Charlotte an 88-86 triumph on 2/12 ... Jackson finished the night with 32 points ... Smith scored 28 to lead Atlanta and Al Horford recorded a double-double (16 points/10 boards) ... Charlotte leads the all-time series 15-12, including a 10-3 home record.

\* Prior to the Atlanta-San Antonio game at Philips Arena on 4/5, the Hawks' Marvin Williams was awarded the Jason Collier Memorial Trophy by the organization for his dedication to community service. The Jason Collier Memorial Trophy, named after the late Hawks center who passed away 10/15/05, is presented annually to the individual who best exemplifies the characteristics Collier displayed off the court as a community ambassador. It is the second time Williams has won the trophy (2007-08 season).

\* Al Horford is the recipient of the NBA Cares Community Assist Award for March in recognition of his outstanding efforts in the community and his ongoing philanthropic and charitable work, the NBA announced today. This marks Horford's second NBA Cares Community Assist Award, following an honor in 2008. The All-Star will be presented with the award tonight prior to the Hawks' final regular season home game against Miami (7 p.m. tipoff).

\* Kirk Hinrich, Jason Collins and Pape Sy joined Atlanta Flames alumnus Dan Bouchard and staff volunteers from the Hawks, Thrashers, Philips Arena and The Home Depot for a tree mulching project in and around Vine City as part of the organization's "Follow Our LEED" sustainability initiative. Through the Hawks' "Threes for Trees" program presented by The Home Depot, a donation will be made to Trees Atlanta for every three-pointer made by the Hawks during the 2010-11 season.

### NEWS & NOTES

\* Rookie swingman Pape Sy made his NBA debut at Indiana on 4/8, finishing with 1 steal in 3 minutes of action. The following night at Washington, Sy scored 7 points (2-4 FGs, 3-3 FTs) and grabbed 1 rebound in 9 minutes of work.

\* SportSouth has announced that the network will televise the Hawks vs. Bobcats game in Charlotte on Wednesday, 4/13 at 8 p.m. ET in high definition. With the addition of the 4/13 game, SportSouth will televise a total of 76 regular-season Hawks games during the 2010-11 NBA season.

\* Marvin Williams scored his 5000<sup>th</sup> career point vs. San Antonio on 4/5.

\* Jason Collins (sprained left ankle) and Josh Smith (sprained right knee) are listed as day-to-day.

\* Jamal Crawford has made 18 consecutive free throws, with his last miss coming on 3/20 vs. Detroit. On the season, he leads the team in FT% at .855 (22<sup>nd</sup> in NBA).
