UPCOMING GAMES



Wednesday, Jan. 30, 2013 vs. Toronto Raptors (7:30 p.m.)

TV: SportSouth HD ... Radio: 680 AM/93.7 FM

Toronto visits Atlanta for the first time this year in the first-of-three games between the clubs ... The Hawks travel north of the border on 3/27 before hosting the Raptors again on 4/16 to finish the season series ... Atlanta took last year's series, 3-1, including the last meeting, a 109-87 road decision on 4/16/12 ... The Raptors won the last game at Philips Arena on 4/15/12 (102-86) ... The Hawks lead the all-time series 37-27, including a 19-13 home mark.



Saturday, Feb. 2, 2013 vs. Chicago Bulls (7 p.m.)

TV: SportSouth HD ... Radio: 680 AM/93.7 FM

The Hawks host the Bulls for the second time this year in the third-and-final meeting between the teams ... Atlanta and Chicago split the previous two contests, each winning at home ... The Hawks posted a 92-75 win on 12/22, behind Al Horford's double-double (20 points/10 rebounds) ... Luol Deng had 11 points for Chicago ... The Bulls evened things up with a 97-58 triumph on 1/14 behind Carlos Boozer's 20 points and 13 boards ... Mike Scott led Atlanta with 10 points ... Chicago leads the all-time series 117-102, with the Hawks holding a 61-46 edge in home games.



Tuesday, Feb. 5, 2013 at Indiana Pacers (7 p.m.)

Atlanta heads to Indiana for the first time this year in the third-of-four matchups between the clubs ... The Hawks have taken the first two games – on 11/7 (89-86) and 12/29 (109-100) ... The Pacers host Atlanta again on 3/25 to finish the season series ... Al Horford is averaging 18.0 points against the Pacers this year and Zaza Pachulia is putting up 11.5 points and 14.0 rebounds, grabbing 14 boards in both contests ... David West is averaging 24.5 points against Atlanta this season, topping 20 points in both games ... The Hawks have won four straight against the Pacers overall, including the last meeting in Indiana on 3/6/12 (101-96) ... The Pacers' last win in the series was a 96-84 home triumph on 1/11/12 ... Atlanta leads the all-time series 92-75 (33-50 on the road).

* In conjunction with NBA Fit Live Healthy Week, Zaza Pachulia and Ivan Johnson will be leading a free, one-hour yoga class for 40 children from C.H.O.I.C.E.S. (Center for Helping Obesity in Children End Successfully). The event will take place on 1/29 (beginning at 5 p.m.) at Athleta in Atlantic Station. This is not a public event. Media wishing to attend are asked to contact the Hawks Media Relations Department.

* On 2/1, the Atlanta Hawks will take over the Ron Clark Academy (RCA) for a full day of educator training, basketball-based curriculum in the classrooms and player visits. The event is made possible by a \$25,000 donation from the Atlanta Hawks Foundation, and is part of the RCA Educator Training Program, featuring 60 of Georgia's top teachers. Training will occur from 8 a.m. until 4 p.m. at RCA with Hawks players John Jenkins, Kyle Korver, Anthony Morrow and Zaza Pachulia making appearances in the classrooms throughout the day. * Tickets are on-sale now for the Atlanta Hawks Foundation's "Casino Night" fundraiser set for 3/10 at Opera (beginning at 6 p.m.). NEWS & NOTES

* In perhaps the club's biggest comeback in franchise history, the Hawks overcame a 27-point deficit, pulling away in the second overtime to beat Boston, 123-111 on 1/25. Atlanta trailed by 27 in the second quarter before trimming the lead to 19 at halftime. The game matched the largest halftime deficit overcome in franchise history (at Baltimore on 1/25/1969 and at Orlando on 4/2/2004) and broke the record for biggest home comeback win (previously 18 on 1/31/60 vs. Syracuse and 11/15/96 vs. Miami).

* The Hawks shot .742 from the field in the second half of the 104-96 win vs. Minnesota on 1/21, helping erase an 18-point deficit. Since the NBA began tracking first and second half stats in 1997-98, no Hawks team has had a higher shooting percentage in any half.

* On 1/25 vs. Boston, Kyle Korver set a career-high with eight 3FGM (8-12), also setting the Hawks' franchise record for three's in a half (eight in the second half). Korver finished the night with a season-best 27 points.

* Last week, Josh Smith moved into 41st place on the NBA's all-time blocked shot list (currently 1394), passing Clifford Robinson. Smith also dished out his 2000th career assist on 1/23 at Charlotte.

* Kyle Korver passed Hersey Hawkins, Stephen Jackson, Damon Stoudamire and Jason Williams last week, moving into 35th place in NBA history with 1243 career three-pointers.

* Atlanta tied a franchise record, set earlier this season (12/26-12/31), by hitting 10-plus three-pointers in four straight games 1/21-1/27. The Hawks have hit double-digit three's 16 times overall this year, second best in team history.

THIS WEEK IN HAWKS HISTORY

January 31, 2001 – Dikembe Mutombo pulls down 29 rebounds (12 offensive, 17 defensive) in the Hawks' 102-97 home win over Toronto. It is the third best single game rebounding performance since the team moved to Atlanta.

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
