GAME ONE RECAP

The Hawks scored the first six points of the game but the Pacers responded with an 11-0 run before finishing the first quarter with a 34-26 advantage ... Indiana maintained the eight-point lead at halftime (58-50) ... The lead ballooned to 17 points in the third but the Hawks wouldn't go away, cutting it to 89-81 with just over seven minutes to play in the game ... The Pacers pulled away after that and posted a 107-90 win to take a 1-0 series lead ... Jeff Teague led the Hawks with 21 points and seven assists ... Josh Smith tallied 15 points and eight rebounds, Al Horford had 14 points and Ivan Johnson 10 points off the bench ... Six Pacers, including all five starters, scored in double-figures ... Paul George recorded a triple-double with 23 points (17-18 FTs), 12 assists and 11 boards ... George Hill added 18 points, Roy Hibbert 16, Lance Stephenson and David West 13 apiece, and Gerald Green 11 ... The Hawks shot .500 from the field (38-76) but couldn't overcome Indiana's huge edge at the free throw line ... The Pacers hit 30-34 (.882) from the charity stripe while Atlanta made 7-14 (.500) ... Indiana also won the battle of the boards 48-32.

ALL-TIME REGULAR SEASON/POSTSEASON

Atlanta and Indiana square off in a first round playoff series after splitting four games in the regular season ... The Hawks took the first two contests (both at Philips Arena) before dropping the last two at Indiana ... The Hawks have won 11 consecutive regular season home games in the series, with the Pacers' last win coming on 12/22/06 (100-90) ... Atlanta leads the all-time regular season series 92-77 (58-25 at home, 33-52 on the road, 1-0 on neutral court) ... Jeff Teague (5.3 assists) and Al Horford (7.8 rebounds) each averaged 16.0 points in the four games between the clubs this year ... David West tallied 21.3 points against the Hawks, seeing action in three-of-the-four contest ... This will mark the fourth time Atlanta and Indiana have met in the postseason (all in the first round) ... The Hawks have taken two-of-the-three series*, winning 3-1 in 1987 and 3-2 in 1996, while falling in 1995 (3-0).

COMMUNITY NEWS

* Devin Harris was the recipient of this year's Jason Collier Memorial Trophy, awarded annually to the individual who best exemplifies the characteristics Collier displayed off the court as a community ambassador.

NEWS & NOTES

* Atlanta ranked second in the NBA (first in the Eastern Conference) at 24.5 assists per game, third in fast break points (first in the East) at 17.7, seventh in 3FG% (.371) and seventh in FG% (.464).

* Kyle Korver finished the regular season with a streak of 73 consecutive games with at least one made three-pointer, the fourth-longest streak in NBA history behind Dana Barros (89 games), Michael Adams (79) and Dennis Scott (78).

* Josh Smith was the only NBA player to average at least 17.0 points, 8.0 rebounds, 4.0 assists, 1.5 blocks and 1.0 steals and was one-of-three players in the league (Kevin Durant and LeBron James to rank in the top 40 in PPG, RPG, APG, SPG and BPG).

* Kyle Korver's 189 3FGM ranked fourth on the Hawks' all-time single season list. Jeff Teague's 579 assists were the eighth-most in a single season in team history and his .881 FT% is fourth on Atlanta's all-time single season list. Al Horford's 562 defensive rebounds ranked 10th on the Hawks' all-time single season chart.

* Al Horford ranked sixth in the NBA in double-doubles (43), eighth in RPG (10.2), ninth in Efficiency Rating (23.5), 10th in FG% (.543), t25th in PPG (17.4) and t30th in BPG (1.1). Kyle Korver ranked second in the NBA in 3FG% (.457) and fourth in 3FGM (189). Josh Smith ranked tied for ninth in the NBA in BPG (1.8), 18th in RPG (8.4), 19th in double-doubles (29), t23rd in PPG (17.5), 36th in APG (4.2) and 36th in SPG (1.2). Jeff Teague ranked eighth in the NBA in FT% (.881), 12th in APG (7.2) and 24th in SPG (1.5).

* John Jenkins ranked fifth among all NBA rookies in 3FG% (.384), t18th in PPG (6.1) and t19th in APG (0.9).

* Rookie forward Mike Scott notched his first two career double-doubles vs. Toronto on 4/16 (12 points and 12 rebounds) and 4/17 at New York (career-highs of 23 points and 14 boards).

* Atlanta used 29 different starting lineups this year (tops in the league), with all 15 players currently on the roster recording a starting assignment.

* At New York on 4/17, Shelvin Mack set or tied career-highs in points (14), field goals made (six), minutes (35) and steals (two).
