### UPCOMING GAMES



**Wednesday, Apr. 10, 2013 at Philadelphia 76ers (7 p.m.)**

**TV: SportSouth HD ... Radio: 680 AM/93.7 FM**

The Hawks visit Philadelphia for the second time this year in the fourth-and-final battle with the 76ers ... The 76ers own a 2-1 record against Atlanta, winning the first meeting in Philadelphia, 99-80, on 12/21 ... The teams split two games at Philips Arena, with Atlanta winning 107-96 on 3/6 and dropping a 101-90 decision on 4/5 ... Al Horford is averaging 15.3 points and 10.0 rebounds against the 76ers this season (two double-doubles) ... The Sixers have won four straight home games against the Hawks, with Atlanta's last win in Philadelphia coming on 10/29/10 (104-101) ... The 76ers lead the all-time series 159-158 (90-49 at home).



**Friday, Apr. 12, 2013 vs. Milwaukee Bucks (7:30 p.m.)**

**TV: SportSouth HD ... Radio: 680 AM/93.7 FM**

Atlanta goes for a season sweep of Milwaukee as the Hawks host the Bucks for the second time this year in the last of four meetings between the clubs ... Al Horford is averaging 24.3 points and 11.0 rebounds against Milwaukee this season (two double-doubles), while Josh Smith is putting up 16.7 points and 12.7 rebounds (two double-doubles) and Jeff Teague 19.3 points and 9.3 assists in three games against the Bucks this year ... The Hawks have won three-in-a-row against the Bucks at Philips Arena, with Milwaukee's last win coming on 11/10/10 (108-92) ... The all-time series is tied 99-99, with the Hawks holding a 64-35 edge at home.

### NEWS & NOTES

\* The Hawks have clinched a postseason berth for the sixth consecutive season, tied with Boston for the longest active playoff streak in the Eastern Conference. Atlanta is currently the sixth seed in the East.

\* Last week, Kyle Korver extended his streak of games with at least one three-pointer made to 70 contests. His streak moved past that of Reggie Miller (68) and is the fourth-longest in NBA history.

\* Against Philadelphia on 4/5, Josh Smith converted the 4000<sup>th</sup> field goal of his career. Also last week, Smith moved into 10<sup>th</sup> place in Hawks history with 2163 assists, passing Spud Webb.

\* On 4/6 at San Antonio, guard John Jenkins (23 points, 7-9 FGs) and forward Mike Scott (22 points, 8-15 FGs) became the first pair of Atlanta rookies to score 20 points on .500 shooting from the field since Josh Childress and Josh Smith accomplished the feat on 4/17/05 at New York.

\* At San Antonio (4/6), John Jenkins had his second career four-point play and the 28<sup>th</sup> four-pointer in Hawks history. He became the fourth Hawk to have multiple four-point plays in his Atlanta career, joining Jamal Crawford, Salim Stoudamire and Kyle Korver.

\* Hawks center Johan Petro tied his career-high with 15 rebounds against the Spurs on 4/6 to go along with 11 points, one assist, one steal and one block in 31 minutes. It was his second double-double of the season.

\* On 4/6 at San Antonio, guard Shelvin Mack tied career-highs with 12 points and two 3FGM, adding eight assists, one rebound and one steal in 25 minutes.

\* Dahntay Jones set a new career-high by playing 43 minutes on 4/6 at San Antonio.

\* Zaza Pachulia had surgery on 4/3 to repair his sore right Achilles at Mercy Hospital in Charlotte, NC. The surgery was performed by Dr. Robert Anderson of OrthoCarolina with Hawks Team Physician Dr. Michael Bernot of Peachtree Orthopaedic Clinic attending. Pachulia will now undergo a period of rest, treatment and rehabilitation. The expected recovery time is approximately six months.
