Monday, Mar. 24, 2014 vs. Phoenix Suns (7:30 p.m.)

TV: SportSouth HD ... Radio: 92.9 FM

The Hawks host the Suns in the second-and-final matchup this season ... Phoenix took the first meeting 129-120 at home on 3/2 ... Jeff Teague led Atlanta in points (29) and assists (9) ... Gerald Green scored a game-high 33 points to lead the Suns ... Atlanta's last victory in the series came at Philips Arena on 3/15/13 (107-94) ... The Suns lead the all-time series 68-49, though the Hawks own a 30-25 mark in Atlanta.



Wednesday, Mar. 26, 2014 at Minnesota Timberwolves (8:00 p.m.)

Atlanta travels to Minnesota for the second-and-final contest between the clubs this season ... The Hawks won the first meeting 120-113 in Atlanta on 2/1 ... Kyle Korver (team-high 24 points) and Paul Millsap (20 points and 13 rebounds) led the Hawks ... Kevin Love had game-highs in points (43) and rebounds (19) for Minnesota ... The Timberwolves won the last meeting in Minnesota on 1/8/13 (108-103), with Atlanta's most recent road victory coming on 11/5/10 (113-103) ... The Hawks lead the all-time series 30-16 (11-11 on the road).



Thursday, Mar. 27, 2014 vs. Portland Trail Blazers (7:30 p.m.)

The Hawks welcome the Trail Blazers to Philips Arena for the second-and-final contest between the teams this year... Portland won the first matchup at home on 3/5 (102-78) ... Cartier Martin led Atlanta with a game-high 16 points and team-high tying six rebounds ... Nicolas Batum recorded a game-high 18 rebounds to go with 14 points for the Trail Blazers ... Portland has won two-in-a-row over Atlanta, including the most recent contest at Philips Arena on 3/22/13 (104-93) ... The Hawks last defeated the Blazers on 11/12/12 (95-87) in Portland and their most recent home victory came on 1/18/12 (92-89) ... The Trail Blazers lead the all-time series 52-51, with the Hawks holding a 33-17 edge at home.



Saturday, Mar. 29, 2014 at Washington Wizards (8:00 p.m.)

Atlanta travels to Washington for the fourth-and-final matchup of the season ... The Wizards took the first meeting 108-101 at home on 11/30 ... The Hawks won the second matchup 101-99 (OT) on 12/13 at Philips Arena ... Washington was victorious in Atlanta on 2/19 (114-97) ... Atlanta's Paul Millsap has recorded a double-double in all three contests, averaging 20.0 points and 10.7 rebounds ... John Wall has recorded a double-double in all three games for the Wizards, averaging 20.0 points and 11.7 assists ... Washington has won two straight over the Hawks at home, with the last Atlanta road victory coming on 12/18/12 (100-95) ... The Hawks lead the all-time series 145-136 (46-88 on the road).

COMMUNITY NEWS

* On 3/20, the Hawks hosted a Wheelchair Basketball Clinic at Philips Arena with the American Association of Adapted Sports Programs (AAASP) Wheelchair Basketball State Championship Teams. Players from the defending state champion Houston County Sharks and the Henry County Hurricanes participated in the clinic, engaging in shooting and passing drills with Al Horford and Mike Muscala, as well as Assistant Coaches Kenny Atkinson and Jim Thomas.

* Al Horford joined NBA Cares, the NBA's global social responsibility program, and WildAid in launching 'No Hype,' a new campaign to reduce demand for ivory and rhino horn. Visit www.hawks.com for complete details

NEWS & NOTES

* On 3/18, the Hawks defeated Toronto to win their season-high fifth consecutive game. The five-game winning streak was the longest since 1/16/12-11/28/12 (six games).

* On 3/17 at Charlotte, the Hawks set three defensive season-bests. They held the Bobcats to .353 FG% for the game and 31 points on .289 FG% in the second half (both season-lows for any half).

* Paul Millsap recorded his first career triple-double on 3/18 vs. Toronto, tallying 19 points, 13 rebounds and a career-high 10 assists in 38 minutes. It was the first triple-double for a Hawk since 11/28/10 (Josh Smith at Toronto). The contest was Millsap's 600th career NBA game. On 3/17 at Charlotte, Millsap converted the 3000th field goal of his career.

* On 3/18, Jeff Teague tied his career-high by scoring 34 points (11-18 FGs, 1-2 3FGs, 11-11 FTs) in 40 minutes. He added five assists, a season-high tying four steals and three rebounds. His 11 FTM is the highest single-game total of his career without a miss.

* On 3/18, Kyle Korver played in his 800th career game and extended his streak of consecutive free-throws made to 28 (last miss on 2/21 at Detroit).

* Pero Antic recorded his second career double-double on 3/17 at Charlotte, scoring 11 points and pulling down 10 rebounds. He added two assists and a steal in 27 minutes.

* Shelvin Mack tied a career-high by making four three-pointers on 3/21 vs. New Orleans. He totaled 18 points (7-11 FGs, 4-8 3FGs), four assists and three rebounds in 33 minutes.

* On 3/23 at Toronto, DeMarre Carroll tied a career-high with five steals. He added 17 points and four rebounds in 37 minutes. Carroll had four steals in the first quarter, the most by a Hawk in one quarter this season. Over the last five games, he is averaging 3.6 steals, posting four-or-more three times.

* Last week, Elton Brand moved past Cedric Maxwell into 96th place on the all-time free-throws made list (currently at 3601).

* Kyle Korver has missed the last two games (3/21 and 3/23) due to back spasms. His status will be updated as appropriate.

THIS WEEK IN HAWKS HISTORY

March 27, 1958 – The St. Louis Hawks defeat Detroit, 120-96, in the Western Division Finals to take the series 4-1 and advance to the NBA Finals. The Hawks would go on to defeat Boston 4-2 to claim the NBA title.
