UPCOMING GAMES



Monday, Feb. 2, 2015 at New Orleans Pelicans (8:00 p.m.)
TV: SportSouth HD/NBA TV ... Radio: 92.9 FM

The Hawks travel to New Orleans for the only time this year in the second-of-two games between the clubs ... The Hawks won the first meeting at Philips Arena on 11/28 (100-91) ... Jeff Teague scored 26 points and Al Horford recorded a double-double (10 points/10 rebounds) for the Hawks ... Jrue Holiday and Ryan Anderson each scored 20 points for New Orleans ... The Pelicans took the last meeting in New Orleans (105-100) on 2/5/14, while Atlanta's last road win in the series came on 1/1/13 (95-86) ... New Orleans leads the all-time series 16-12 (10-4 at home).



Wednesday, Feb. 4, 2015 vs. Washington Wizards (7:30 p.m.)
TV: SportSouth HD ... Radio: 92.9 FM

Atlanta hosts the Wizards for the final time in the third-of-four meetings between the teams ... The clubs will play once more in Washington, DC on 4/12 ... The Hawks lead the season series 2-0, after winning in Washington on 11/25 (106-102) and at Philips Arena on 1/11 (120-89) ... Jeff Teague is averaging 19.5 points, 6.5 assists, 3.5 steals, 2.5 rebounds and 1.0 blocks against the Wizards this season ... John Wall is averaging 18.0 points, 10.5 assists, 5.0 rebounds, 1.0 steals and 1.0 blocks against the Hawks this year ... The last time the Wizards won in Atlanta was on 2/19/14 (114-97) ... The Hawks lead the all-time series 147-137, including a 93-43 home mark.



Friday, Feb. 6, 2015 vs. Golden State Warriors (7:30 p.m.)
TV: SportSouth HD ... Radio: 92.9 FM/105.3 FM

Atlanta welcomes the Warriors to Philips Arena for the only time this year in the first-of-two games between the clubs ... The teams will play again in Oakland on 3/18 ... The Warriors swept the 2013-14 series 2-0, own a five-game win streak overall and have won three consecutive games at Philips Arena against the Hawks ... Atlanta's most recent victory over the Warriors was on 2/25/11 (95-79) in Oakland, while the last home triumph came on 12/29/10 (103-93) ... Atlanta leads the all-time series 141-139, including a 83-42 home record.



Sunday, Feb. 8, 2015 at Memphis Grizzlies (6:00 p.m.)
TV: SportSouth HD ... Radio: 92.9 FM

The Hawks travel to Memphis for the only time this year in the second-of-two games between the clubs ... The Hawks won the first meeting at Philips Arena on 1/7 (96-86) ... Jeff Teague recorded 25 points and six assists for the Hawks ... Mike Conley posted 17 points and nine assists for the Grizzlies ... The Grizzlies won 108-101 the last time the teams met in Memphis on 1/12/14 ... Atlanta's last road victory in the series came on 12/8/12 (93-83) ... The Hawks lead the all-time series 24-13 and are 9-8 on the road.

* Each February, the Atlanta Hawks and Philips Arena celebrate 'Black History Month' by honoring influential African-Americans who have made significant contributions to the Atlanta community and beyond. Each game during the month will feature a vignette highlighting key figures in the civil rights movement culminating with in-game recognition of all five honorees during the 2/20 game vs. Toronto. NEWS & NOTES

- * Atlanta is on a franchise record 19-game winning streak (12/27/14-1/31/15), which is tied for fifth-longest single season run in NBA history. The Hawks have also won a season-high 10 consecutive games at Philips Arena (12/30-1/31).
- * The Hawks are 33-2 (.943) over the last 35 contests, making them the seventh team in NBA history to win at least 33-of-35-games in a single season. At 40-8 overall for the season, Atlanta has the best record in the NBA, the first time the Hawks have owned the league's top spot this late into a year since moving to the city for the 1968-69 season.
- * The Hawks were 17-0 in the month of January, breaking the franchise record for wins in a single month (previously 14 in January 1997 and December 2014). Atlanta became the first team in NBA history to go 17-0 during a calendar month and the second to win 17 games in a month (Miami 17-1 in March 2013).
- * With a 105-99 triumph over Portland (1/30), Atlanta has won 12 consecutive games against the Western Conference (extending the single-season franchise record).
- * The Hawks have had home sellout crowds in 10-of-the-last 12 games and now have 11 sellouts on the year. In the previous two seasons combined, Atlanta had nine total sellouts at Philips Arena.
- * Al Horford, Paul Millsap and Jeff Teague have been selected by the Eastern Conference coaches to the All-Star team, and will compete in the 2015 All-Star game on 2/15 at Madison Square Garden in New York. This marks the first time since 1980 that the Hawks have had three All-Stars.
- * Dennis Schröder has been selected by the NBA's assistant coaches to play in the BBVA Compass Rising Stars Challenge on 2/13 at the Barclays Center. He will be a member of the World Team, which is coached by Hawks Assistant Coach Kenny Atkinson.
- * On 1/30 vs. Portland, Kent Bazemore recorded 12 points, three assists and two steals in a career-high 40 minutes. That same night, Jeff Teague (currently 285) passed Jamal Crawford for eighth in Hawks franchise history for made three-pointers.
- * On 1/28 vs. Brooklyn, Paul Millsap had 28 points (also 15 rebounds) on 5-9 FGs, 3-5 3FGs and a career-high 15-16 FTs, and became the fourth player in NBA history to score at least 28 points in a game on five-or-fewer FGM and at least .500 FG%.
- * Last week, Al Horford moved passed Dikembe Mutombo into ninth in franchise history in double-doubles (currently 183).

THIS WEEK IN HAWKS HISTORY

February 5, 1972 – Pete Maravich scores 50 points in Atlanta's 120-117 home win over Cleveland. It is tied for the ninth-highest single game scoring effort in franchise history. Maravich's 20 made field goals (20-27) are tied for sixth on the club's all-time list.
