UPCOMING GAMES



Wednesday, Mar. 25, 2015 at Orlando Magic (7:00 p.m.)
TV: SportSouth HD ... Radio: 92.9 FM

The Hawks travel to Orlando for the second time in the fourth-and-final game this year between the clubs ... Atlanta leads the season series 2-1, after winning at home twice on 12/12 (87-81) and 2/27 (95-88), and losing in Orlando on 12/13 (100-99) ... Jeff Teague is averaging 18.0 points, 6.7 assists, 2.7 rebounds and 2.3 steals against the Magic this season ... Nikola Vucevic is averaging 19.5 points, 13.0 rebounds, 1.5 assists and 1.0 blocks against the Hawks this year ... The last time the Hawks defeated the Magic in Orlando was on 1/22/14 (112-109) ... Atlanta leads the all-time series 51-48 and is 18-32 on the road.



Friday, Mar. 27, 2015 vs. Miami Heat (7:30 p.m.)
TV: SportSouth HD ... Radio: 92.9 FM

Atlanta hosts Miami for the second time in the fourth-and-final meeting this season between the teams ... Atlanta leads the season series 3-0, after winning at home on 11/14 (114-103) and twice in Miami on 12/3 (112-102) and 2/28 (93-91) ... Paul Millsap is averaging 18.3 points, 6.7 rebounds, 3.7 assists and 2.0 steals against the Heat this season ... Dwyane Wade is averaging 25.0 points, 5.5 assists, 3.5 rebounds and 2.5 steals against the Hawks this year ... The Hawks have won five consecutive games against the Heat, including three straight at Philips Arena ... The Heat's most recent victory in the series came on 12/23/13 (121-119) in Miami, while the last win at Philips Arena was a 103-90 decision on 2/20/13 ... Miami leads the all-time series 57-45 with the Hawks holding a 30-20 advantage at home.



Saturday, Mar. 28, 2015 at Charlotte Hornets (7:00 p.m.)
TV: SportSouth HD ... Radio: 92.9 FM

The Hawks travel to Charlotte for the final time in the third-of-four meetings between the teams ... The clubs will play once more at Philips Arena on 4/10 ... The Hornets won the first contest in Charlotte on 11/7 (122-119 2OT) before the Hawks bounced back for a 105-75 home win on 11/29 ... Al Horford is averaging 17.5 points, 7.0 rebounds, 2.0 assists, 1.5 steals and 1.5 blocks versus Charlotte this season, while Al Jefferson is averaging 22.5 points, 6.0 rebounds, 1.5 assists and 1.0 blocks against the Hawks ... The Hawks' most recent victory in Charlotte came on 3/17/14 (97-83) ... The Hawks lead the all-time series 56-43 and are 23-25 on the road.

COMMUNITY NEWS

- * Hawks radio play-by-play announcer Steve Holman was honored by the Georgia State House of Representatives on the House floor on 3/23 after meeting with Gov. Nathan Deal. House Resolution 308 recognizes Holman for being named the 2014 Georgia Sportscaster of the Year by the National Sportscasters and Sportswriters Association (NSSA) and for the exceptional work he has done in his 30-year career.
- * Jeff Teague will sign autographs and take pictures with fans at the Atlanta International Auto Show on 3/26. The event is being held at the Georgia World Congress Center from 3/25-3/29. Visit www.goautoshow.com for more information.
- * On 3/22, the Hawks honored Jamie Johnson, Executive Director at *Boy With a Ball* with the 'Be Greater Atlanta Award,' presented by SunTrust. *Boy With a Ball* works to better cities by reaching young people and equipping them to be leaders capable of transforming their communities. Johnson was presented the award by former Hawks forward Duane Ferrell.

NEWS & NOTES

- * Atlanta has clinched the Southeast Division title, the first division crown for the franchise since taking the Central in 1993-94.
- * The Hawks have set a new franchise record for road wins with 23 (previously 22 in 1986-87). Atlanta's 23-12 record away from home is the best road mark in the Eastern Conference (second in the NBA) and the 23 road wins are tied for the most in the league.
- * Pero Antic recorded his first career 20-point game with 22 points on 6-9 FGs, 4-6 3FGs and 6-7 FTs in 20 minutes off the bench at Oklahoma City on 3/20. In addition to setting a career-high in points, he tied career-bests with four 3FGM and six FTM.
- * DeMarre Carroll posted his third double-double of the season with 16 points and a career-high tying 12 rebounds at Golden State on 3/18.
- * Dennis Schröder scored in double-figures in nine consecutive outings from 2/28-3/16 (the longest streak of his career).
- * Dennis Schröder tied a career-best with three 3FGM at Oklahoma City on 3/20, ending the night with 21 points, four assists and three rebounds (7-14 FGs, 3-5 3FGs, 4-4 FTs).
- * Jeff Teague recorded his 500th career steal at Oklahoma City on 3/20. Teague currently has 503 steals, ranking just outside the franchise's all-time Top 10 list (Jon Koncak is 10th with 515).
- * Kyle Korver returned to the court on 3/22 vs. San Antonio after missing three games due to a broken nose (3/16-3/20). He finished the contest with six points (2-3 3FGs), three rebounds, two assists, one steal and one block in 29 minutes.

* The Hawks-Heat game on 3/27 will feature GRAMMY Award-nominated rapper Tauheed "2 Chainz" Epps, as he will perform three times throughout the night. The first 5,000 fans to arrive will be given copies of his latest mixtape, "T.R.U Jack City."
