SERIES RECAP

The teams have held home floor through the first three games, with each club recording victories on its home court. The Hawks won Game 1 and Game 2 at Philips Arena and the Nets won Game 3 in Brooklyn. Game 4 will be played at the Barclays Center on 4/27 and Game 5 is scheduled for 7:00 p.m. at Philips Arena on 4/29. For the Hawks, Paul Millsap is averaging 14.3 points, 10.3 rebounds, 2.3 assists, 2.3 steals and 1.3 blocks (.667 3FG%) in the series, while Jeff Teague is putting up 15.0 points, 5.0 assists, 2.0 rebounds and 1.7 steals. Brooklyn's Brook Lopez has recorded two double-doubles and is averaging 19.7 points, 11.3 rebounds and 1.7 blocks.

ALL-TIME REGULAR SEASON

Atlanta and Brooklyn square off in a first round playoff series after the Hawks swept the regular season series (4-0) ... The Hawks sandwiched two home wins (113-102 on 1/28 and 131-99 on 4/4) in between two road triumphs (98-75 on 12/5 and 114-11 on 4/8) in 2014-15 ... Al Horford averaged 17.8 ppg and 6.0 rpg, while Jeff Teague tallied 14.8 ppg and 9.0 apg against Brooklyn this year ... Brook Lopez averaged 18.8 ppg and 7.5 rpg, while Joe Johnson tallied 15.8 ppg and 4.5 rpg versus Atlanta this season ... The Hawks are 95-69 all-time against the Nets in the regular season (59-22 at home and 36-47 on the road) ... This is the first time the Hawks and Nets have met in the postseason.

* On 4/22, the NBA and NBPA announced that the NBA's first game in Africa will take place 8/1 in Johannesburg, South Africa. Atlanta Head Coach Mike Budenholzer and former Hawks star Dikembe Mutombo are scheduled to participate. More information will be released at a later date.

* The Hawks and T.MAC (formerly named Taco Mac) have joined forces to make T.MAC the Official Watch Party Location for 2015 Hawks road playoff games, presented by Kia Motors. Twenty-five T.MAC restaurants in metro Atlanta will transform into Hawks Headquarters for every away game during Atlanta's postseason run. Visit www.hawks.com for more details.

NEWS & NOTES

* Head Coach Mike Budenholzer is the recipient of the Red Auerbach Trophy as the 2014-15 NBA Coach of the Year. He is the sixth Hawks Coach to take home the award, joining Harry Gallatin (1962-63), and Richie Guerin (1967-68) of the St. Louis Hawks, and Atlanta's Hubie Brown (1977-78), Mike Fratello (1985-86) and Lenny Wilkens (1993-94).

* The Hawks held a 2-0 lead in the 2015 NBA Playoffs First Round series vs. Brooklyn (before the Nets won Game 3), the ninth time the team has had a 2-0 playoff series lead since moving to Atlanta for the 1968-69 season. Atlanta is 8-0 all-time after holding a 2-0 series advantage.

* Paul Millsap joined Larry Bird and Charles Barkley as the only players in NBA playoff history to have at least 18 points, 17 rebounds, five steals, three assists and one block in a game (Game 3 on 4/25). He is the only one of the three to do so while making a three-pointer. His five steals were a postseason career-high and tied for the third-highest single game total in Hawks playoff history, while the 17 rebounds are tied for seventh all-time.

* Al Horford recorded 14 points, 13 rebounds, a career playoff high seven assists, two blocks and one steal in Game 2 versus Brooklyn on 4/22, becoming the 19th player in NBA history to record at least that line in a postseason game and second Hawk (Josh Smith twice) to do so.

* Last week, three players moved up the Hawks' all-time playoff leaderboard in several categories (Atlanta-era): Al Horford became the all-time leader in rebounds with 448, while moving into a tie for third in games played (51) and blocked shots (58), sixth in assists (145), tied for seventh in double-doubles (18) and ninth in FTM (105); Jeff Teague is now seventh in assists (137) and 3FGM (25), and eighth in steals (35) and FTM (107); Kyle Korver jumped to fifth all-time in 3FGM (43).

* In Game 3 at Brooklyn on 4/25, DeMarre Carroll had 22 points (9-12 FG, 3-5 3FG, 1-2 FT), six rebounds and one steal, setting or tying playoff career-highs in points, steals, FGM and 3FGM. In the same contest, Kent Bazemore set postseason career-highs in points (six) and rebounds (five), and Mike Scott set a playoff career-high in rebounds (five).

* In the Game 2 96-91 victory versus Brooklyn on (4/22), DeMarre Carroll set a postseason career-high in assists (five), Kyle Korver set a playoff career-high in steals (four), Dennis Schröder had postseason career-highs in assists (six) and steals (two), Pero Antic tied a playoff career-high in points (eight) and Paul Millsap tallied a postseason career-high in 3FGM (four), finishing the night with 19 points (7-11 FGs, 4-4 3FGs, 1-2 FTs), seven rebounds, two assists and two blocks.
