### ALL-TIME REGULAR SEASON/POSTSEASON

Atlanta won the regular season series, for the fifth straight year, 3-1 against Cleveland (14-3 during that span) ... The Cavaliers took the first game in Cleveland on 11/15 (127-94), before Atlanta was victorious in the final three games of the series: in Cleveland on 12/17 (127-98) and at Philips Arena on 12/30 (109-101) and on 3/6 (106-97) ... Atlanta currently owns a five-game home regular season winning streak in the series, with the Cavaliers' last win at Philips Arena coming on 11/30/12 (113-111) ... Seven Hawks averaged at least 10.0 points against the Cavs this year, including Paul Millsap (18.0), Al Horford (17.0), Jeff Teague (14.7), Mike Scott (11.5), Dennis Schröder (10.5), DeMarre Carroll (10.3) and Shelvin Mack (10.0) ... LeBron James averaged 23.7 points, 5.7 assists, 5.0 rebounds and 1.3 steals against Atlanta this season ... The Hawks lead the all-time series 117-96, including a 70-35 home mark (47-61 on the road) ... The 2015 NBA Playoffs marks the second time Atlanta and Cleveland have met in the postseason ... Cleveland was victorious in the previous series against the Hawks, taking the Eastern Conference Semifinals in 2009 (4-0) ... The Hawks are the top seed in the Eastern Conference and champions of the Southeast Division, while the Cavaliers are seeded second in the conference after winning the Central Division.

### COMMUNITY NEWS

\* Jeff Teague will host his inaugural 'Hoops 4 Hughes Dinner' on 8/15 at Maggiano's Buckhead to assist Children's Healthcare of Atlanta at Hughes Spalding. Teague is giving \$20 to Children's Healthcare of Atlanta for every assist he made during the 2013-14 NBA regular season and playoffs. ### NEWS & NOTES

\* The Hawks reached the Eastern Conference Finals for the first time in franchise history after defeating Brooklyn in the First Round and Washington in the Eastern Conference Semifinals. This marks the first time the Hawks have won multiple playoff series in a single season since 1958, when the then St. Louis Hawks knocked off the Pistons in the Western Division finals and the Celtics in the NBA Finals.

\* Atlanta set a franchise playoff record with 13 blocked shots in Game 5 vs. Washington (5/13). Al Horford tied his postseason career-high with five rejections in the contest.

\* Last week, five players moved up the Hawks' all-time playoff leaderboard in several categories (Atlanta-era): Jeff Teague moved into third in assists (211), fifth in steals (49), seventh in games played (48), ninth in points (592) and 10<sup>th</sup> in FGM (210); Al Horford is now third in FGM (331), fifth in points (780), tied for eighth in FTM (115), and jumped to fifth in franchise history with 23 double-doubles; Paul Millsap now ranks ninth in blocks (26), ninth in 3FGM (23) and 10<sup>th</sup> in steals in (32); and Kyle Korver is second in 3FGM (70).

\* Jeff Teague led or tied for team-high honors in scoring and assists in both Games 3 and 4 at Washington, after recording 18 points and seven assists in Game 3 and 26 points and eight helpers in Game 4. According to the Elias Sports Bureau he is the third Hawk since 1972 to lead or tie for team-highs in points and assists in back-to-back playoff games, joining Joe Johnson (2010 against Milwaukee) and Pete Maravich (1972 against Boston).

\* On 5/13 vs. Washington (Game 5), Al Horford became one-of-six players in NBA history to have at least 23 points, 11 rebounds, five blocks, two assists and zero turnovers in playoff game. Additionally Horford is the first player since Tim Duncan in 2005 to score a game-winning basket in the final two seconds of a playoff game in which he was the leading (outright or tied) scorer and rebounder (according to the Elias Sports Bureau).

\* In Game 6 at Washington (5/15), three Hawks' players scored 20-or-more points: DeMarre Carroll (playoff career-high 25), Paul Millsap (20) and Jeff Teague (20). It was the third time this postseason that three Hawks' players scored at least 20-points (3-0 record). Carroll also set tied postseason career-bests with in rebounds (10), FGM (nine) and steals (two).

\* In Game 5 vs. Washington (5/13), several Hawks set or tied playoff career-highs, including Pero Antic in FTM (four); Kent Bazemore in rebounds (five), steals (two) and blocks (two); DeMarre Carroll in rebounds (10), steals (two) and blocks (two); Mike Muscala in points (eight), rebounds (three), FGM (four) and minutes (15); Dennis Schröder in rebounds (five); and Kyle Korver in steals (six).

\* In Game 4 at Washington (5/11), three Hawks set or tied playoff career-highs, including Pero Antic in FGM (three); Jeff Teague in FGM (nine); and Dennis Schröder in assists (eight) and 3FGM (two).

\* Atlanta's 82-81 victory over Washington on 5/13 (Game 5) generated an 11.0 household (HH) rating in the Atlanta DMA, making the contest the most-watched game in Hawks history. Through the first 11 games of this postseason, the Hawks are averaging a 7.2 HH rating locally, up 67% from the club's 2014 playoff appearance.
