GAME 1 RECAP

The Hawks started out hot, taking a 37-26 lead after one and holding a 63-53 halftime advantage ... Atlanta shot .522 FG%, .529 3FG% (9-17) and .857 FT% (6-7) in the opening 24 minutes ... Atlanta went up 12 early in the third before Washington came back to trim it to 83-81 heading to the final frame ... The Wizards retook the lead with just over 10 minutes to play in the game and would not trail again ... Down 98-91 with under three minutes to go, the Hawks managed to cut it to 98-96 with 1:21 showing on the clock, but could get no closer ... Atlanta shot .250 FG% in the second half, including a 4-21 showing from three-point range (.190) ... All five Hawks starters scored in double-figures led by DeMarre Carroll's 24 (21 in the first half) ... Al Horford (17 points/17 rebounds/seven assists/one steal/one block) and Paul Millsap (15 points/12 rebounds/eight assists/two steals/two blocks) both had double-doubles ... Kyle Korver added 13 points and Jeff Teague 11 ... Bradley Beal put in a game-high 28 points for the Wizards, while John Wall (18 points/13 assists), Marcin Gortat (12 points/12 rebounds) and Otto Porter (10 points/11 boards) posted double-doubles ... Atlanta had advantages of 42-32 in points in the paint and 20-14 in fast break points, while Washington outscored the home team 25-14 in second chance points and 18-11 in points off turnovers.

ALL-TIME REGULAR SEASON/POSTSEASON

Atlanta and Washington meet in the Eastern Conference Semifinals after the Hawks won the regular season series (3-1) ... The Hawks were victorious in the first three games of the regular season series: in Washington on 11/25 (106-102) and at Philips Arena on 1/11 (120-89) and on 2/4 (105-96), before Washington won the final contest at the Verizon Center on 4/12 (108-99) ... Jeff Teague averaged 21.7 points, 7.0 assists, 3.0 steals and 2.3 rebounds, while Al Horford averaged 14.3 points, 7.7 rebounds, 2.3 assists and 1.3 blocks against Washington this season ... John Wall averaged 21.0 points, 9.8 assists, 5.3 rebounds and 1.3 steals versus Atlanta this season ... The Hawks are 148-138 all-time against the Wizards in the regular season (94-43 at home and 47-90 on the road) ... The Hawks have met Washington twice in the postseason previously, with the Wizards winning both series' (1978 and 1979).

COMMUNITY NEWS

* Kyle Korver is the recipient of the Joe Dumars Trophy presented to the 2014-15 NBA Sportsmanship Award winner. Korver is the first Hawks player to receive the honor. The NBA will make a \$10,000 donation on behalf of Korver to his charity of choice, Helping Hand Rescue Mission.

* On 4/25, the Hawks participated in the first annual Peachtree Sports Festival at the Cobb Galleria. Former Hawks players Duane Ferrell and Mike Glenn coached more than 200 children through basketball clinics over the duration of the weekend. Additionally, the Hawks awarded 25 students, chosen from Big Brothers Big Sisters of Atlanta, with scholarships to Atlanta Hawks Basketball Camps this summer.

NEWS & NOTES

* The Hawks have reached the Eastern Conference Semifinals for the first time since the 2011 Playoffs. Since moving to Atlanta for the 1968-69 season, the Hawks have made the second round of the postseason 14 times.

* Atlanta has made 13 3FGs in a game four times during the 2015 NBA Playoffs, which is tied for second on the franchise's all-time single game list for the postseason.

* Atlanta dished out 34 assists in the Game 6 win at Brooklyn (5/1), the fifth-highest total in Hawks playoff history and the most since handing out 38 on 5/16/88 vs. Boston. Jeff Teague led the way with a postseason career best 13 assists.

* DeMarre Carroll (24), Al Horford (20) and Jeff Teague (20) all scored 20-plus points vs. Brooklyn on 4/29 (Game 5), while Paul Millsap (25), Kyle Korver (20) and Carroll (20) all put in at least 20 points at Brooklyn on 5/1 (Game 6). According to the Elias Sports Bureau it is the first time since 4/13-4/15/66 that the Hawks had three 20-point scorers in back-to-back playoff games.

* Jeff Teague (20 points/11 assists), Paul Millsap (16 points/12 rebounds) and Kyle Korver (16 points/11 boards) all recorded double-doubles in Game 4 at Brooklyn (4/27). It was the first time Atlanta has had three players with double-doubles in the same playoff game since Mookie Blaylock, Christian Laettner and Dikembe Mutombo turned the trick at Detroit on 5/2/97.

* Last week, five players moved up the Hawks' all-time playoff leaderboard in several categories (Atlanta-era): Al Horford moved into second in games played (55), third in blocked shots (61), sixth in FGM (292), sixth in assists (161), seventh in double-doubles (20) and ninth in FTM (110); Jeff Teague is now fifth in assists (176), sixth in steals (42), sixth in FTM (117) and ninth in games played (43); Paul Millsap moved into a tie for ninth in blocks (22) and 10th in 3FGM (20); DeMarre Carroll is now eighth all-time in 3FGM (28); Kyle Korver jumped to fourth all-time in 3FGM (61).

* DeMarre Carroll has scored 20-or-more points in each of the last five postseason games. He is the first Hawk to score 20-plus in five consecutive playoff games since Dominique Wilkins from 4/27-5/7/89.

* In Game 1 versus Washington on 5/3, DeMarre Carroll set or tied postseason career-highs in points (24) and 3FGM (five); Paul Millsap tallied a playoff career-high in assists (eight); and Al Horford set or tied postseason career-highs in rebounds (17) and assists (seven). Carroll also recorded 24 points (8-15 FGs, 2-5 3FGs, 6-8 FTs), seven rebounds, three assists and two steals in Game 5 versus Brooklyn on 4/29, setting postseason career-highs in points, steals and FTM.

* Kyle Korver became the first player in NBA playoff history to have 20 points, eight rebounds, four assists, three steals and six 3FGM in a game (at Brooklyn 5/1).

THIS WEEK IN HAWKS HISTORY

May 8, 1994 – Mookie Blaylock dishes out 18 assists in Atlanta's 102-91 home playoff win over Miami. It is tied for the second most assists ever recorded for a Hawks player in the postseason.
