UPCOMING GAMES



Tuesday, Mar. 1, 2016 at Golden State Warriors (10:30 p.m.)

TV: FOX Sports Southeast HD/NBA TV ... Radio: 92.9 FM

The Hawks visit the Warriors for the only time this season in the second-and-final contest between the clubs ... Golden State took the first matchup, 102-92, at Philips Arena on 2/22 ... Al Horford recorded 23 points, 16 rebounds, six assists, five blocks and three steals for Atlanta ... Stephen Curry posted 36 points, eight assists, six rebounds and three steals for the Warriors ... Golden State has taken two straight games overall against Atlanta and three-in-a-row at home ... The Hawks' last victory in the series was a 124-116 home triumph on 2/6/15, while the last road win came on 2/25/11 (95-79) ... The Hawks lead the all-time series 142-141, with the Warriors holding a 77-44 advantage at home.



Friday, Mar. 4, 2016 at Los Angeles Lakers (10:30 p.m.)

TV: FOX Sports Southeast HD/ESPN ... Radio: 92.9 FM

The Lakers host Atlanta in the second-of-two meetings between the teams ... The Hawks lead the series 1-0, after a 100-87 victory at Philips Arena on 12/4 ... Al Horford tallied 16 points, nine rebounds, five assists, one steal and one block for Atlanta ... D'Angelo Russell posted a double-double (16 points/10 rebounds), while adding four assists and one steal for the L.A. ... The Hawks have won two straight games in the series including a 91-86 victory on 3/15/15 at the Staples Center ... The last time the Lakers defeated the Hawks was on 11/18/14 (114-109) at Philips Arena, with the most recent home victory coming on 11/3/13 (105-103) ... Since the Hawks moved to Atlanta, the Lakers lead the all-time series 75-47 and are 44-17 at home.



Saturday, Mar. 5, 2016 at Los Angeles Clippers (10:30 p.m.)

TV: FOX Sports Southeast HD ... Radio: 92.9 FM

The Hawks visit the Clippers in the second-of-two games between the clubs ... Los Angeles leads the series 1-0, after an 85-83 win at Philips Arena on 1/27 ... Paul Millsap posted a double-double (14 points/12 rebounds) and finished the evening with four assists, two blocks and one steal for Atlanta ... DeAndre Jordan recorded a double-double (13 points/19 rebounds), while adding one block for L.A. ... The last time the Hawks defeated the Clippers was on 1/5/15 (107-98) at the Staples Center, with L.A.'s most recent home victory in the series coming on 3/8/14 (109-108) ... The Hawks lead the all-time series 75-40 (31-25 road record).

* The Hawks re-visited one of the renovated basketball courts from this past year during the Jr. Hawks Black History Month Showcase on 2/27. Bessie Branham Park hosted Hawks alumni and metro Atlanta middle school basketball teams for the one-day exhibition. Visit www.hawks.com for more details.

* The Hawks Mean Business Networking Event was held on 2/26 at Philips Arena and featured former Hawks star Kevin Willis as well as Chairman and CEO of TWD Tommy Dortch. Willis and Dortch discussed their experiences as African-American entrepreneurs and the importance of civic leadership. The event was moderated by FOX-5 news anchor Cynne' Simpson.

NEWS & NOTES

* On 2/25, the Hawks received several awards from the Atlanta Sports Council at the 11th annual Atlanta Sports Award ceremony. For 2014-15, the Hawks were named Team of the Year; Paul Millsap was named Professional Athlete of the Year; and Head Coach Mike Budenholzer was awarded Coach of the Year.

* Al Horford recorded his 200th career double-double with 13 points and a season-high tying 16 rebounds, while finishing the afternoon with six assists and one block vs. Charlotte (2/28).

* Against Golden State (2/22), Jeff Teague (currently 592) passed Jason Terry for seventh on the Hawks' all-time steals list, and dished out his 2500th career assist (currently 2522).

* Al Horford recorded 23 points, 16 rebounds, six assists, five blocks and three steals in 39 minutes vs. Golden State (2/22); setting or tying season-highs in blocks, rebounds and steals. Horford is the first player in franchise history to record at least that statistical line, and the first in the NBA to do so this season.

* In the victory over Chicago (2/26), Paul Millsap posted his team-leading 21st double-double of the season with 12 points and 13 rebounds, while finishing the evening with five blocks, four assists and two steals in 33 minutes. Millsap is the second player in the NBA this season (Al Horford vs. Golden State on 2/22) to record at least that stat line in a game.

* On 2/26, Atlanta assigned Lamar Patterson and Edy Tavares to Austin of the NBA Development League before recalling both players on 2/28. Patterson has seen action in seven D-League contests this year with Austin, averaging 15.6 points, 5.7 assists, 5.0 rebounds and 1.0 steals. Tavares has played in 14 D-League games this season (12 with Austin and two with Canton), with averages of 10.1 points, 9.6 rebounds and 2.3 blocks (.685 FG%, .750 FT%).

* Kirk Hinrich was acquired from Chicago in three-team transaction (also involving Utah) on 2/18 for his second tour of duty with the Hawks. Hinrich's last game in a Bulls uniform was against Atlanta on 2/10 before making his 2015-16 Hawks debut vs. Chicago (2/26). According to the Elias Sports Bureau, the last NBA player to play his last game against the team he was traded to and then his first game against his former club was Manute Bol in 1993-94 (Miami and Washington).

* The Hawks' game against the Golden State Warriors on 2/22 generated a 2.9 household (HH) rating in the Atlanta DMA on FOX Sports Southeast. The game tied for the highest-rated Hawks regular season game of the 2015-16 season (11/3 vs. Miami). Additionally, the game peaked at a 4.0 HH rating with more than 96,000 households tuned in during the 9:45 p.m. ET quarter hour, marking the highest peak rating of the 2015-16 season.
