SERIES RECAP

Each team has held home court through the first four games of the series ... Atlanta topped Boston at Philips Arena 102-101 in Game 1 and 89-72 in Game 2 ... The Celtics responded by winning at the TD Garden 111-103 in Game 3 and 104-95 in overtime in Game 4 ... Game 5 will be played at 8:30 p.m. in Atlanta on 4/26 and Game 6 will be held in Boston on 4/28 at a time to be determined ... For the Hawks, Jeff Teague is putting up 18.0 points, 7.0 assists, 2.3 rebounds and 1.3 steals in the series, while Paul Millsap is averaging 17.8 points, 9.3 rebounds, 2.8 blocks, 2.0 assists and 1.3 steals ... Boston's Isaiah Thomas is averaging 28.3 points, 4.3 assists, 3.5 rebounds and 1.0 blocks.

ALL-TIME REGULAR SEASON/POSTSEASON

Atlanta and Boston square off in a first round playoff series after the Hawks won the regular season series 3-1 ... Six Hawks averaged over 10.0 points against the Celtics this year, including Paul Millsap (22.5), Kent Bazemore (16.0) and Al Horford (14.3) ... Isaiah Thomas scored at a 20.5 points per game clip against Atlanta this season ... This marks the 12th time the Hawks and Celtics have met in the postseason (previously three times in the first round, four times in the second round and four times in the finals) ... The only time the Hawks have defeated the Celtics was in the finals in 1958 (4-2) ... The Hawks are 27-42 all-time against the Celtics in the postseason (21-10 at home and 6-32 on the road).

NEWS & NOTES

* In Game 2 vs. Boston (4/19), Atlanta held the Celtics to an all-time (shot-clock era) NBA playoff low for points in a first quarter with seven, also tying a Hawks' opponent low for points in any quarter in postseason play (seven fourth quarter points by Miami on 4/19/09). Additionally, Atlanta limited the Celtics to 28 first half points, an all-time opponent playoff low for first half scoring (previous low was 30 by Indiana on 4/27/13).

* In Game 2 vs. Boston (4/19), the Hawks set a franchise playoff record with 15 blocks, which is tied for the sixth most by any team in the playoffs since 1984-85. Al Horford tied a postseason career-high with five rejections in the victory. The last team to post 15 blocks in the playoffs was the LA Lakers on 4/29/12.

* Paul Millsap tallied 45 points (19-31 FGs, 3-6 3FGs, 4-6 FTs), 13 rebounds, four blocks, three assists and two steals in Game 4 at Boston (4/24), tying the Hawks' postseason franchise record for FGM held by Hall of Famers Dominique Wilkins and Bob Pettit, while turning in the club's fifth-highest playoff scoring effort – Wilkins (50 and 47), Pettit (50), Zelmo Beaty (46). He is the first player in NBA postseason history to record at least that stat line in a single game and set personal playoff career-highs in points and FGM.

* In Game 3 at Boston (4/22), Dennis Schröder recorded postseason career-highs with 20 points and eight FGM in 22:26 of playing time. He became the first Hawks since Sidney Moncrief on 5/2/91 (against Detroit) to have a 20-point playoff game in fewer than 23 minutes of playing time.

* Last week, three players moved up the Hawks' all-time playoff leaderboard in several categories (Atlanta-era): Al Horford moved into third in points (878), second in FGM (372) and fourth in assists (205); Jeff Teague is now tied for second in games played (56), third in FTM (171), tied for fifth in 3FGM (47), sixth in points (750), seventh in FGM (266) and 10th in blocks (24); Paul Millsap jumped to seventh in blocks (38), eighth in steals (40), 10th in FTM (112) and 10th in rebounds (252).

* In the 89-72 victory versus Boston on (4/19), Kent Bazemore recorded playoff career-highs in rebounds (nine) and assists (four), Thabo Sefolosha tied a postseason career-high in blocks (two) and Al Horford set or tied playoff career-highs in blocks (five) and 3FGM (three), finishing the evening with 17 points (6-11 FGs, 3-4 3FGs, 2-2 FTs), five rebounds, five blocks, two assists and one steal.

* For the second time in the series, Atlanta had three 20-point scorers at Boston (4/22), when Jeff Teague (23), Kent Bazemore (20) and Dennis Schröder (20) turned the trick. In Game 1 on 4/16, Al Horford (24), Bazemore (23) and Teague (23) hit the 20-point mark.

* On 4/21, Walter Tavares and Lamar Patterson were recalled after competing in NBA Development League Playoffs for the Austin Spurs. The Spurs won their first round series against the Rio Grande Valley Vipers 2-1 but then fell to the Los Angeles D-Fenders 2-1 in the Western Conference Finals.

THIS WEEK IN HAWKS HISTORY

April 26, 1987 – Hall-of-Famer Dominique Wilkins sets a Hawks postseason record by attempting 37 FGs in Atlanta's 94-93 Eastern Conference first round home win over Indiana.
