UPCOMING GAMES



Tuesday, Nov. 8, 2016 at Cleveland Cavaliers (7:00 p.m.)

TV: FOX Sports Southeast HD/NBA TV ... Radio: 92.9 FM

The Hawks travel to Cleveland in the first-of-four meetings with the Cavaliers ... The teams will matchup again in Atlanta on 3/3 and 4/9, and once more in Cleveland on 4/7 ... The Cavaliers swept the 2015-16 series 3-0 before taking the Eastern Conference Semifinals matchup 4-0 ... The Hawks' most recent victory against the Cavaliers was a 106-97 home triumph on 3/6/15, while the last road win came on 12/17/14 (127-98) ... The Hawks lead the all-time series 117-99 (47-63 on the road).



Wednesday, Nov. 9, 2016 vs. Chicago Bulls (7:30 p.m.)

TV: FOX Sports Southeast HD ... Radio: 92.9 FM

Atlanta hosts the Bulls in the first-of-four games between the teams ... The clubs will meet again at Philips Arena on 1/20, and in The Windy City on 1/25 and 4/1 ... The Hawks have won four straight over Chicago after sweeping last season's series (4-0), including two straight on the road ... The last Bulls' win in the series was a 91-85 home decision on 4/15/15, with the last victory at Philips Arena coming on 4/2/14 (105-92) ... The Bulls lead the all-time series 123-108, with the Hawks holding a 64-49 advantage at home.



Saturday, Nov. 12, 2016 vs. Philadelphia 76ers (7:30 p.m.)

TV: FOX Sports Southeast HD ... Radio: 92.9 FM

The Hawks welcome Philadelphia for the second-of-four games between the clubs ... The teams will meet again in Atlanta on 1/21, and once more in Philadelphia on 3/29 ... The Hawks took the first game, a 104-72 road decision on 10/29 ... Atlanta has won four consecutive games in the series overall and five straight contests at Philips Arena ... The last time the 76ers defeated the Hawks was on 3/7/15 (92-84) at the Wells Fargo Center and their most recent victory in Atlanta came on 4/5/13 (101-90) ... The Hawks lead the all-time series 169-160 (102-52 at home).

COMMUNITY NEWS

* On 11/6, the Hawks partnered with non-profit organization Sunshine on a Ranney Day (SOARD) to provide a surprise room makeover for 16-year-old wheelchair basketball player Kalen Reese. Hall-of-Famer Dominique Wilkins, along with Malcom Delaney, Tim Hardaway Jr. and Kris Humphries were all on hand for the reveal of the newly renovated wheelchair accessible Hawks-themed bathroom and bedroom. Friends, neighbors and members from Reese's high school basketball and cheerleading teams were also on-hand for the event. Additionally, the Reese family will be special guests of the Hawks for the 12/2 game vs. Detroit.

* The Hawks unveiled the *Breaking Barriers: Sports for Change* exhibit for the public on 10/27, at the 2016-17 regular season opener vs. Washington. The 800 square foot traveling exhibit, presented by the National Center for Civil and Human Rights and ESPN, explores the history of civil and human rights in sports through stories of athletes. It features narratives of overcoming barriers because of race, disabilities, gender or sexual orientation from past and present greats including Muhammad Ali, Martina Navratilova, Terry Fox, Jackie Robinson, Billie Jean King and Jesse Owens. The exhibit will be available to fans in Philips Experience through 11/12.

NEWS & NOTES

* On 11/1, the Atlanta Hawks Basketball Club and the City of Atlanta announced an agreement on key terms for a \$192.5 million renovation of Philips Arena. The Hawks committed to an 18-year lease extension to remain in downtown Atlanta through 2046.

* The Hawks won each of their first three regular season games by double-digits – 114-99 vs. Washington (10/27), 104-72 at Philadelphia (10/29) and 106-95 vs. Sacramento (10/31) – for the first time since moving to Atlanta in 1968. Atlanta also started 3-0 for the first time since the 2011-12 season.

* Paul Millsap and Kent Bazemore scored 23 and 20 points respectively and center Dwight Howard added 20 in the Hawks' 112-97 home win over the Rockets (11/5). It was the third time in the last 14 seasons that all three members of Atlanta's starting frontcourt scored at least 20 points. The previous two games also came against Houston, on 1/15/11 (Joe Johnson 30, Al Horford 24, Josh Smith 21) and 12/29/15 (Horford 30, Bazemore 26, Millsap 22).

* Mike Muscala and Dwight Howard rank No. 1 and 2 in the NBA in FG% this season. Muscala is hitting .710 while Howard is shooting at a .617 clip.

* Dennis Schröder tallied 17 points, a career-best 12 assists and three rebounds vs. Houston on 11/15. He was one-of-three Hawks to post a double-double that night, along with Paul Millsap (23 points/11 rebounds) and Dwight Howard (20 points/14 rebounds).

* Dwight Howard tallied 31 points and 11 rebounds in 31:42 of playing time vs. the L.A. Lakers on 11/2, becoming the third Hawk since the 1963-64 season to have a 30/10 game in 32-or-fewer minutes – Kevin Willis (vs. Philadelphia 1/30/93) and Josh Smith (at Orlando 2/13/13).

* Mike Muscala tallied 10 points and three rebounds in 20 minutes vs. Sacramento (10/31), hitting 2-4 FGs and a career-high 6-8 FTs.

* Tim Hardaway Jr. (currently 2023) scored his 2000th career point vs. the Lakers (11/2), finishing the night with 26 points (8-10 FGs, 5-7 3FGs, 5-7 FTs), one assist and one block.

* Thabo Sefolosha (currently 4001) scored his 4000th career point in the win over Houston (11/5).

* On 10/31, Atlanta waived Edy Tavares and signed Ryan Kelly. Kelly made his Hawks debut in the home win over Houston on 11/5.

November 10, 1969 – Lou Hudson ties Bob Pettit's franchise record by scoring 57 points against Chicago (in Auburn, AL). Hudson also set new team records for made field goals (25) and made field goals in one half (15) during the contest.
