Monday, Feb. 13, 2017 at Portland Trail Blazers (10:30 p.m.)

TV: TNT ... Radio: 92.9 FM

Atlanta visits Portland in the first-of-two-meetings between the clubs ... The teams will matchup once more at Philips Arena on 3/18 ... The Hawks swept the 2015-16 series 2-0, with a 106-97 home victory on 12/21/15 and a 104-98 road decision on 1/20/16 ... Atlanta has won four consecutive games against the Trail Blazers overall, including two straight on the road ... The last time the Trail Blazers defeated the Hawks was on 3/27/14 (100-85) at Philips Arena, while the most recent home win occurred on 3/5/14 (102-78) ... The Hawks lead the all-time series 56-53 (20-34 road record).



Wednesday, Feb. 15, 2017 at Los Angeles Clippers (10:30 p.m.)

The Hawks travel to Los Angeles for the second-of-two-games against the Clippers ... The Clippers lead the 2016-17 series 1-0, after 115-105 victory at Philips Arena on 1/23, in which Dwight Howard posted a double-double (16 points/12 rebounds) for the Hawks, and Austin Rivers scored 27 points for L.A. ... Atlanta has won two straight games against the Clippers at the Staples Center, with the most recent victory happening on 3/5/16 (107-97) ... The last time the Clippers posted a home win over the Hawks came on 3/8/14 (109-108) ... Atlanta leads the all-time series 76-41 and is 32-25 on the road.

* In observation of Black History Month the Hawks collaborated with Black Fives Foundation to celebrate the pre-NBA history of African-Americans in basketball, also known as the Black Fives Era (1904-1950). On 2/11 and 2/12 the Hawks Basketball Academy hosted its second annual Black History Month Tournament at Gresham Recreation Center. Sixteen teams, ages 12-14, from the metro Atlanta area were invited to take part in this tournament. Special guests included former Hawks Rick Brown, Charlie Criss and Salim Stoudamire.

NEWS & NOTES

* The Hawks notched their third wire-to-wire victory of the season in the 117-106 triumph vs. Denver on 2/8. The previous two wire-to-wire wins were at Brooklyn on 1/10 and vs. Orlando on 2/4.

* Last week, Dwight Howard moved past Dale Davis and into a tie with former Hawk Elton Brand for 21st on all-time NBA/ABA offensive rebounds list with 3,304. Howard is also 13th on the career defensive rebounds chart with 8,475, trailing Buck Williams by 16 for 13th place.

* Atlanta is currently fifth in the NBA in spg (8.4), while ranking fourth in forcing turnovers as foes are committing 15.3 miscues per game (leading to 16.8 points, t10th in the NBA). The Hawks are also sixth in the NBA in assists at 24.1 per game, dishing out at least 20 helpers in 43 contests, including 25-plus on 27 occasions (six 30-assist nights).

* Paul Millsap was selected by the Eastern Conference coaches to his fourth consecutive All-Star team, and he will compete in the 2017 NBA All-Star Game on 2/19 in his home state at Smoothie King Center in New Orleans, LA. Millsap joins Dominique Wilkins, Bob Pettit, Lou Hudson, Joe Johnson, Dikembe Mutombo and Cliff Hagan as the only players in franchise history to earn All-Star honors in four straight seasons.

* Dennis Schröder recorded his ninth double-double of the season with 24 points and 10 assists, while adding five rebounds and three steals against Denver (2/8); becoming the first Hawk since Mike Bibby on 4/2/08 (vs. Toronto) to post at least 24 points, 10 assists, five rebounds and three steals in a game.

* Tim Hardaway Jr. set a career-best with nine consecutive games scoring in double-figures from 1/25-2/10/17. Over the last five games Hardaway Jr. is averaging 22.0 ppg on .534 FG%; scoring at least 14 points in each contest, including two 20-point nights and a career-high 33 at Houston on 2/2.

* The Hawks signed Lamar Patterson to a second 10-day contract on 2/8.

THIS WEEK IN HAWKS HISTORY

February 16, 1988 – Dominique Wilkins scores 51 points, the eighth-highest scoring game in franchise history, in Atlanta's 118-115 loss against Sacramento. Wilkins set team records for points in a quarter (28) and half (36) during the game, and his 20 made field goals is tied for sixth on the team's all-time list.
